Terms & Conditions

The West Prince Arts Council is a regional, volunteer-based arts organization, committed to encouraging and supporting arts and cultural activities in the West Prince region of Prince Edward Island.

Through funding provided by the P.E.I. Department of Community and Cultural Affairs, the W.P.A.C. offers grant funds for community-based projects in the craft, dance, theatre, music, visual art, and writing and publishing disciplines. The council meets monthly at various locations throughout West Prince.

The following is a list of Terms and Conditions:

- The funding program is available to not-for-profit individuals and organizations resident* in the West Prince region, living on or west of routes 135 (Harmony Line Rd) and 132 (Northam Rd).
- Funding is available to encourage, support and promote artists and projects in the craft, dance, drama, music, visual art and writing and publishing disciplines in West Prince.
- Funding is available to a maximum of \$600.
- Projects funded must be completed by fiscal year end. A financial statement must be provided by the successful applicant, to the board, at the end of the project.
- Different phases of the project may be funded in a different fiscal year, however projects will not be funded a second time if it is determined that they are artificially severed.
- Projects will be adjudicated by the Board of the West Prince Arts Council.
- Projects that receive funding from the Community Cultural Partnership Program or the P.E.I. Council of Arts, are not eligible for assistance from the West Prince Arts Council Grant Program.
- Projects funded must give recognition to the West Prince Arts Council and the P.E.I. Department of Community and Cultural Affairs.
- Individuals and Organizations may be eligible to receive one grant per fiscal year.
- Deadline for applications is 15 March and 15 October, annually.
- Applications must have all supporting documentation and attachments requested, in order to be considered for funding.
- Applications received after the deadline will be kept on file for the next available adjudication.
- Applicants will be notified promptly following the adjudication meeting.
